Physical Development

To be able to hold a pencil using tripod grip applying sufficient pressure to form letters. #

To hold scissors with the correct grip and correct use of the supporting arm

To use scissors to cut curves and lines with control and $$\operatorname{accuracy}$$

To use cutlery independently (please encourage this at home)
To draw and write with increasing accuracy.
Use of playdough with increasingly refined control

Literacy/Communication and Language

To retell stories

To recognise most taught sounds, including digraphs
To segment/blend CV/CVC words and some CVCC/CCVC words
To recognise some tricky words — eg I, the, go, no, to
To write own name with letters accurately formed

To be able to form most letters accurately and to write CVC words independently

To begin to understand the structure of a sentence eg spaces between words, direction

on a page and a full stop.

Modelling different writing styles eg lists, shared journals, speech bubbles and captions



Mastering number curriculum

Pupils will continue to develop their subitising and counting skills and explore the composition of numbers within and beyond 5. They will begin to identify when two sets are equal or unequal and connect two equal groups to doubles. They will begin to connect quantities to numerals.
